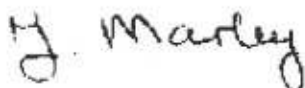
SUBJECT: Update on highway, footpath & other matters since 10/11/16

SUBJECT: Digital mapping software

Background

The Ordnance Survey has for several years made many of its products freely available to local councils through a Public Sector Mapping Agreement. However computer software programmes are necessary in order to utilise this data and some of the more useful sets of data have to be purchased.

At the recent Regional Training Day which the Chairman and I attended, we were able to talk to Pear Technology - one of the main suppliers of digital mapping software to town and parish councils. Since then I have compared their software with similar software from other providers but concluded that Pear Technology provides what will best suit Council's needs for the most cost effective price.

The software allows for many things including:-

- simple printing of a street map
- creation of layout plans
- measuring areas of Council owned land
- recording the location of Council owned assets.
- linking relevant data to mapping records including photographic records of items.
- better management of the asset register

Typical applications of the software include identification of council owned/managed land, management of street furniture, trees, allotment layout/management, building management.

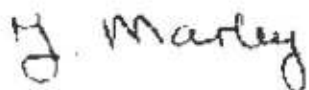
By putting the information into one place instead of being spread across various documents it adds value to our data by providing a comprehensive database that saves staff time, being user friendly and supporting any future changes. This should be looked upon as a future-proof investment.

Finance

- Initial (one off) costs would be £700 for purchase of the software programmes and £350 for the necessary map layers.
- Annual cost for technical support and software updates for the software would be £150.00 per annum
- Initial (one time) training is available at a cost of £500.00 (which includes all the firm's expenses to travel up to Yorkshire with the training laptops etc.). All costs are excluding VAT.

Recommendations

1. Council authorises the purchase of the software and training at a cost not exceeding £1,700+VAT.
