SUBJECT: Update on highway, footpath & other matters since 11/10/17

1. Items raised at previous council meetings:-

1. Poor state of road surface Hay Lane from Church Hill to Hay Brow bottom - down to be done early in the next financial year. In the meantime it will continue to be regularly inspected.
2. A171/Station Road junction - right turn arrow needs repainting
3. Redscar Lane - hedge needs cutting. From further information given at a later date by Cllr. Thompson, it seemed the problem related to convolvulus in field hedges, not hedges overhanging the road so not referred to NYCC Highways.
4. Traffic lights Burniston Rd/Cross Lane junction - timing for right filter arrow needs changing.
5. Lack of pavement on North Street from Stony Lane corner (this is a long-standing issue). Believed to be going to a future meeting of the County Council's Executive with a view to construction in 2018/19.

2. New items

1. 17/10/17 (RT) Large quantity of long grass across Hay Brow Crescent/Hay Lane junction - suspected blown out of adjacent field during overnight gale. NYCC Highways informed who asked SBC to deal on their behalf.
2. 19/10/17 (KM) branch down on tree, northern bank of sea cut between Scalby road bridge and Hackness Road bridge. EA informed - they will have a look and remove if causing a flood risk.
3. 23/10/17 (parishioner) light out at top of steps onto bowling green. Explained responsibility could lie with Community Hall Trustees or SBC & gave contact number for Community Hall.
4. A parishioner raised an issue at CaP meeting on 26/10/17 regarding width of pavements on parts of Scalby Road and Hay Lane. Parishioner then formally notified Parish Council on 31/10/17 and gave additional information. Clerk contacted complainant 31/10/17 requesting permission to forward matter (and parishioner's personal details) to NYCC Highways so they could respond accordingly.
