SUBJECT: Update on highway, footpath & other matters since 12/7/17

1. Items raised at previous council meetings:-

1. Potholes Hay Lane/Church Hill, pavement High Street and Low Street (remedied 17/7/17), Hackness Garden sinking manhole and gutter weeds
2. Hedge at 2 Lady Edith's Avenue - update from NYCC "*letter sent to resident 2/5/17*". Hedge has been trimmed back but not cut hard back so it is still overhanging pavement - NYCC informed 27/6/17 and Inspector asked to assess. Chased 23/8/17.
3. Speeding traffic Cross Lane (raised at June meeting) - Chairman referred to 95 Alive who have now confirmed monitoring equipment will be put in place.

2. New items

1. Potholes at junction of Hay Lane/Hay Brow Crescent and Hay Lane/Church Hill (both with photos) reported to Highways 26/7/17 - sorted by 28/7/17.
2. Raised at CaP meeting on 27/7/17 - Shrubs/trees restricting highway visibility at junctions (Newlands Park Crescent and Hamilton Close) - reported to Area3 Highways 28/7/17 - all sorted by 11/8/17.
3. Highway encroachment at 82 Hackness Road - reported to Area3 Highways 23/8/17.
4. Failed overhead lights at pedestrian crossing near junction Hirstead Road and Coldyhill Lane - reported to Area3 Highways 25/8/17
5. Highway gullies blocked and gutters growing weed (north side of Coldyhill Lane between numbers 35 and 65) - reported to Area3 Highways 25/8/17.

SUBJECT: Allotment plot rental charge, October 2017 onwards

The allotment land at Hackness Road is rented from the Duchy of Lancaster. The land is currently divided into 62 full size plots and 35 half size (or less) plots.

Following a 3 yearly rent review, the Duchy has increased the rent Council is required to pay from £815pa to £840pa.

In accordance with the recommendation of the Finance & General Purposes Committee, on 9th March 2005, Council accepted that future rent increases be fixed for a 3 year period and timed to coincide with the rent reviews by the Duchy of Lancaster.

In 2016/17, the break even rent for a plot (with Clerk's time added at a minimal level of 30 minutes a week), was £32/plot.

Looking at the surplus/deficit on the allotments over the financial years 2011/12 to 2016/17 inclusive, the allotments are currently in surplus by £1,091. It is considered this is a sensible and acceptable level of surplus.

If so minded. Council could increase the rent per plot at the 1st October 2017 renewal. Any increase should be for the three year period 1/10/2017 to 31/9/2020. However I am not aware of any large expenditure planned in the next three years and therefore see no reason to increase allotment rents.

Recommendation to Parish Council

Council resolves to hold the rent at £33/plot for the period 1st October 2017 to 31st September 2020.
