SUBJECT: Update on highway, footpath & other matters since 8/11/17

1. Items raised at previous council meetings:-

1. Lamp post or road sign column at 45 near High Mill roundabout - checked by Clerk and found to be a road sign column. Clerk reported to Highways 10/11/17.
2. Speed concerns, Green Lane/Cross Lane (raised by Cllr. Mrs Snow) - results of recent speed data tests show an 85th percentile speed of 38/37 mph. Speeds are therefore not within the 30mph speed limit and as such are suitable for enforcement by North Yorkshire Police
3. Poor state of road surface Hay Lane from Church Hill to Hay Brow bottom - Stage 3 of the 2018 Tour de Yorkshire will be coming down Hay Brow and up Church Hill, along Scalby High Street, Station Road and Field Lane before joining the A165 near Scalby Manor. If work undertaken on previous year's race routes is taken as a guide, it is likely that work will be undertaken on the road surface by the end of April 2018 so as to remove potholes and bring it up to the necessary standard.

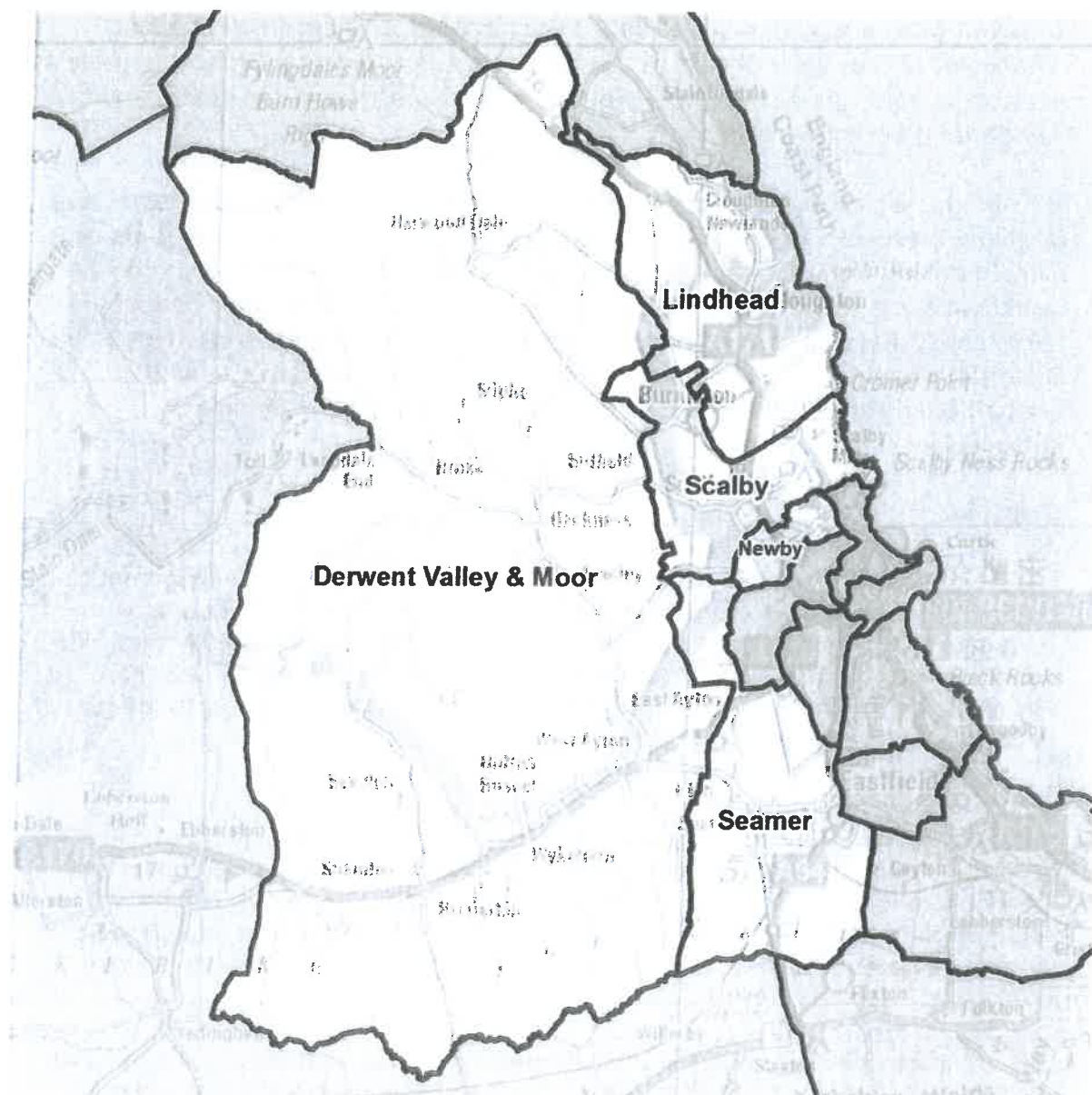
2. New items

1. 10/11/17 (RT) 2 posts and 2 rails from birdsmouth fencing at bottom of Carr Lane around Church Beck green removed/damaged. Clerk reported to NYCC 10/11/17.
2. 15/11/17 Email from member of public asking when Gallows Close playground was to have the toddler swing seat promised over a year ago by a councillor. It transpired the promise had been made by a County or Borough Councillor for Newby. As the playground is owned by the Borough Council, the matter was passed to SBC Parks & Gardens for their action.
3. Various faulty streetlights reported to NYCC via Parish Portal.
4. 29/11/17 Slow running gullies at pelican crossing on Scalby Road opposite causing flooding and making crossing impossible to use - reported to NYCC by email.
5. 2/12/17 Two large potholes Field Lane reported to NYCC via Parish Portal.
6. A parishioner raised an issue at CaP meeting on 26/10/17 regarding width of pavements on parts of Scalby Road and Hay Lane. Parishioner then formally notified Parish Council on 31/10/17 and gave additional information. Clerk contacted complainant 31/10/17 & obtained permission to forward matter (and parishioner's personal details) to NYCC Highways so they could respond accordingly. Highways have now replied to the parishioner to the effect their Inspector would check the areas in question to see if there was a need to side out the footpath.

Newby and Scalby

52 We received two submissions relating to Newby and Scalby. The Council proposed a two-councillor Scalby ward and a three-councillor Newby ward. The Council's Newby ward had an electoral variance of 11%. Newby & Scalby Parish Council proposed the transfer of Endcliff Crescent and Heathcliff Gardens to the Woodlands ward of Scarborough. The Parish Council also proposed the ward boundary be realigned to avoid it running through Charles William Apartments.

53 We are not persuaded by Newby & Scalby Parish Council's proposal to include Endcliff Crescent and Heathcliff Gardens in Woodlands ward. Its proposal would result in Newby ward having an electoral variance of 14%. We do not consider the evidence is sufficiently persuasive to justify this electoral variance. We have realigned the ward boundary to follow the path adjoining Charles William Apartments.

54 While we have decided to base our draft recommendations on the proposals of the Council, we have made a modification to the proposed boundaries to improve electoral equality between wards.

55 We have included electors on Lawrence Grove, The Close and on the south side of Hackness Road and west side of Scalby Road in Newby ward. This change reduces the electoral variance of Newby ward to 8%. Scalby ward will also have an electoral variance of 8%. We also consider this change would reflect community identities.

Conclusions

75 The table below shows the impact of our draft recommendations on electoral equality, based on 2017 and 2023 electorate figures.

Draft recommendation

Scarborough Borough Council should be made up of 46 councillors serving 20 wards representing two single-councillor wards, 10 two-councillor wards and eight three-councillor wards. The details and names are shown in table below and illustrated on the large map accompanying this report.

Parish electoral arrangements

76 As part of an electoral review, we are required to have regard to the statutory criteria set out in Schedule 2 to the Local Democracy, Economic Development and Construction Act 2009 (the 2009 Act). The Schedule provides that if a parish is to be divided between different wards it must also be divided into parish wards, so that each parish ward lies wholly within a single ward. We cannot recommend changes to the external boundaries of parishes as part of an electoral review.

77 Under the 2009 Act we only have the power to make changes to parish electoral arrangements where these are as a direct consequence of our recommendations for principal authority warding arrangements. However, Scarborough Borough Council has powers under the Local Government and Public Involvement in Health Act 2007 to conduct community governance reviews to effect changes to parish electoral arrangements.

78 As a result of our proposed ward boundaries and having regard to the statutory criteria set out in schedule 2 to the 2009 Act, we are providing revised parish electoral arrangements for Newby & Scalby, Osgodby and Whitby.

79 As result of our proposed ward boundaries and having regard to the statutory criteria set out in schedule 2 to the 2009 Act, we are providing revised parish electoral arrangements for Newby & Scalby parish.

Citizens Advice Scarborough & District provides advice to local people for the problems they face, and assists them in finding a way forward. We are a registered charity whose entire running costs rely on donations and grants.

We run offices in Scarborough and Whitby and have 12 paid staff (mostly part-time), and 46 volunteers.

During the financial year 2016/17 we helped **3,857** members of the public with **11,949** issues, which resulted in **£6,839,131** being obtained for clients in benefits, grants and other income/savings. A significant proportion of this will be new money introduced into the local economy.

Attached is a breakdown by Local Authority Ward of clients seen in the last 12 months (Oct 2016 – Sept 2017), and I also attach a copy of our Annual Report for 2016-17 and a leaflet detailing our current services.

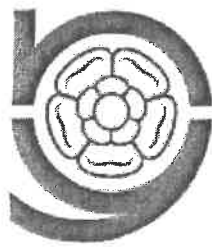
