Recording of crimes connected to Harassment:

In July 2017 the Crown Prosecution Service Inspectorate (CSPI) and Her Majesty's Inspectorate of Constabularies (HMIC) released a joint report relating to harassment and stalking. From this report, The Home Office amended how these crimes were recorded, this will see a rise in recorded crimes.

For example; currently if a victim reported to us that they had been stalked over a number of weeks by an ex partner, culminating in Assault and Criminal Damage to their vehicle, the current recording provision would mean that we would record:

1 x crime – stalking, as this is the principal crime over the assault and damage.

Under the new provision we would need to record:

1 x crime – stalking and;

1 x crime – section 47 assault (the assault in the principal crime over the damage)

1. Items raised at previous council meetings:-

4. 28/5/18. Parishioner complaining about rubbish and untidy state of old bowling green adjacent Community Hall. Complainant referred to Community Hall Trustees since they managed the land.

4/18 REPORT FROM CHAIRMAN OF THE PARISH COUNCIL FOR THE YEAR 2017/2018

On 12th December 2017 Brian Watson sadly died, Brian had been a member of the Parish Council for over 30 years. Two applications for Discretionary Grants totalling £850 were successful. Due to the healthy state of our finances Newby and Scalby Parish Council decided to reduce its precept for 2018/19 (the Parish Council's part of Council Tax) by over 27%, this equates to a reduction of over £8 annually for a band D property. During the last year Councillors have scrutinised 70 planning applications. While Council had no objections to the majority, concerns were submitted on 6 applications and objections were submitted on a further 5 applications. 5 applications were refused by the planning authority. Councillors also submitted over 57 reports concerning highways and footpaths. Council replaced a set of Christmas lights on the Christmas tree at Newlands shops, the improvement has been positively commented on by Parishioners. Recently new sets of Christmas lights were purchased to replace the lights at Victoria Fountain and the cherry tree at Newlands. Newby and Scalby In Bloom Group celebrated their tenth anniversary at the Best Kept Garden competition which Council continues to support and provide prizes for. We are fortunate to have such an active group, and grateful to them for the work they do in our Parish. In the course of its review of Scarborough Borough Council ward boundaries, the Boundary Commission proposed to create a parish ward of 89 houses in and around Hackness Road - this was successfully challenged by Newby & Scalby Parish Council. In 2018 we face a new challenge with the introduction of the General Data Protection Regulations. In one way or another these regulations will affect many aspects of how Council conducts aspects of its business and, although yet to be finalized, are something all Councillors need to be aware of. The Tour de Yorkshire passed through the parish at the weekend. For several weeks beforehand individuals, community groups and businesses were busy erecting bunting and placing blue and yellow bicycles in and around Scalby. Once again I am grateful to Councillor Thompson for his support as Vice Chairman and to my fellow Councillors for their commitment, diligence and support over the last 12 months, without which little would have been achieved. I thank our Borough and County Councillors for their continued help and support. Most importantly I am grateful to our Clerk

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and Responsible Financial Officer Jools Marley, for once again safeguarding our finances and keeping us all in order, it has been my pleasure to work through this with her.

5/18 REPORTS FROM GROUPS OR ORGANISATIONS WITHIN THE PARISH: Reports were received from several organisations and a précis of each report follows:-

- 5/18.1 Scalby & Newby Twinning Association (SANTA) - 34 members went to Pornic in September. The 2018 visit by Pornic is planned for 14th-19th June. A drinks reception and formal dinner is to be held at the Hackness Grange Hotel. During the year various social events have been held.
- 5/18.2 Newby & Scalby In Bloom - We have been very busy with many events and collaborated with many local organisations and firms. Litter picking continues & we are currently growing many plants for sale at our annual plant sale later this month. More volunteers would be very welcome, especially between April and October.
- 5/18.3 Scalby Sports Association Football and Cricket Clubs - The Association represents both the cricket and football clubs. We're trying to bring the pavilion up to modern standards - progress on the new pavilion has been very slow so we're going to renovate the current clubhouse. Between them, the clubs continue to field seven senior playing teams and five junior teams.
- 5/18.4 Newby & Scalby Library & Information Centre - Various community and fundraising events have been held during the year, culminating in the recent Spring Spectacular to celebrate our first year as a Community Library. We continue to build on our connections with local schools and community groups - the "Knit and Natter" and Scrabble groups are proving popular. We're active on social media and have launched a "Friends of the Library" group. We've just received a grant of £10,000 towards a range of projects including maintenance and new furniture, so our plans for the café area can now go ahead.
- 5/18.5 Scarborough Rugby Union Football Club - Another excellent year for this first-class sports facility, fitness & Exercise centre and meeting/social events venue. We have 14 Youth Teams and 3 regular Senior Teams. As well as over 900 club members, membership of the gym now stands at over 1100. We employ 12 full time and 38 part-time members of staff including 9 fitness instructors. We also provide snooker, badminton and various 'walking sports'. Our two squash courts are being replaced by 4 new courts which will provide a home for Scarborough Squash Club.
- 5/18.6 St. Laurence's Church - the seven page annual report by the churchwardens which they gave to their Annual Parochial Church Meeting on 22nd April 2018 was available. We are no longer in vacancy - Rev. Lynn Hellmuth became our vicar on 13th February.
- 5/18.7 Scalby Toilet Trust - The popularity of the toilets continues if it is judged by the breadth of correspondence we receive, however the same cannot be said for donations which are down on previous years. We have carried out various repairs and renewals but even though we do our best to keep costs down, there are still renewals to do for which we must fundraise.
- 5/18.8 FONSA - A busy and productive year on the allotments with some turnover of plots though most vacated plots have been let and the overall standard of plot maintenance is high. Routine inspections continue in order to maintain standards. The social year has been successful. In the last twelve months we have improved the Hackness road entrance by replacing the gate and moving back into the allotments by a car's length. The 2017 Sunflower Competition

raised £120 for St Catherine's Hospice and we hope to run a similar competition in 2018. The annual fruit and vegetable competitions continue as does our stall selling produce at Scalby Fair.

Over the past 6 months, there have been discussions about the role and remit of the Council's 7 Area Committees. The outcome of these discussions was a proposal to the Council AGM on 16 May 2018 to end the existing Area Committees and create 6 Area Constituency Committees in their place. This proposal has been agreed by Council.

As such, the 7 Area Committees no longer exist as committees of the Council and so will not meet as previously scheduled. In their place, there will be the 6 Area Constituency Committees, meeting as outlined below:

This is a fresh start. The focus of the first meeting of the 6 Area Constituency Committees will be upon the practicalities associated with setting up a new committee, electing a Chairman and a Vice Chairman, agreeing any co-option, agreeing terms of reference and establishing a work programme. As such, there will be no time to pick up any routine reports or matters that had previously been taken up by the Area Committees, unless they require urgent consideration.

The area covered by 4 of the 6 the Area Constituency Committees is significantly different to that covered by the Area Committees. As such, the County Councillors on the committees will also be different.

The co-opted posts that had been in place on the Area Committees have ceased. It will be up to the members of the new Area Constituency Committees to decide whether they wish to have co-opted members on the committees, as part of their first meeting.
