SUBJECT: Update on highway, footpath & other matters since 14/2/18

1. Items raised at previous council meetings:-

1. Pothole opposite 14 Hay Lane (report by RIT) - reported to Highways 15/2/18. Case closed by Highways 16/02/2018 "The reported defect has been inspected but does not meet the criteria for further action."
2. Dangerous road surface Scalby Rd near Derwent Close (report by RIT) - reported to Highways 15/2/18. Case closed by Highways 16/02/2018 "The reported defect has been inspected but does not meet the criteria for further action."

2. New items

1. Obstruction of pavements by overhanging hedges at numbers 2 and 63 Lady Edith's Avenue reported to Highways 12/2/18. 27/2/18 Highways said no action to be taken as both hedges within minimum allowance (minimum width of 1m from hedge to edge of verge or kerb)
2. Poles on highway verge at two locations on The Green reported to Highways and 16/2/18 and 21/2/18. Email from Highways 22/2/18 - removal letters sent to homeowners.
3. Bus services serving north of Scarborough and run by EYMS are being re-organised. Within this parish, services 12-15 inclusive are ending on 15/4/18 and new services 9, 9A and 11 with slightly different routes begin 16/4/18. Tibby Butts, North Street and Barmoor Lane will still be on a bus route.
4. Email regarding lack of street lighting between the entrance to the Camping and Caravanning Club site and the Field Lane/Burniston Road junction - NYCC street lighting contacted by complainant.
5. Snicket between Scalby Road and The Green - complaint from parishioner re. state of path (potholes and tree roots). Historical problem, land between Scalby Road and rear of 372 Scalby Road owned by SBC (who have done some recent repairs). Assumption NYCC owns/is responsible for rest. 26/2/18 updated parishioner.
