Incidents reported 01/10/2018 - 31/10/2018:

Crime

- Five crimes in Scalby during October.
- Three violence and two drugs offences.
- Out of the three violence crimes, one is a minor injury and the other two resulted in no injury.
- The two drugs crimes were both very small amounts of cannabis located on people being dealt with for other matters.

Anti-Social Behaviour

- One ASB incident where a member of the public was refusing to leave the County Council Offices on Scalby Road. The male left prior to Police arrival, no offences were committed.

Traffic Breakdown

- There were no road related issues in Scalby during October.

Other

- Throughout the year PC Bilton and PCSO Lockey have been attending schools in the rural area. The purpose of the visits was to speak to pupils, teachers and parents about online safety, how to stay safe in the community, what the job of the police entails, rural wildlife crime and how to report crime and anti-social behaviour. Further talks are planned in the next few weeks.

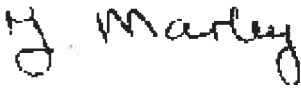

SUBJECT: Update on highway, footpath & other matters since 10/10/18

1. Items raised at previous council meetings:-

2. New items

1. 19/10/18 Cllrs. Sutton & Wiles reported overfull bin at Scalby Road sea cut entrance. Clerk referred to SBC same day & bin emptied by 9am on 20/10/18.
2. 3/11/18 Road sign outside Bravender Court (junction of Scalby Road/Hackness Road) - one of the two uprights completely rusted through and post resting on ground. Clerk referred to Highways same day.
3. The red horse chestnut tree at Foulsyke Pond did not look very well in spring so Council's arboricultural consultant was asked to look at the tree when passing. Having inspected the tree & diagnosed a fungal infection, removal of the tree was recommended. Any replacement tree should be of a different species. The Council's tree surgeon quoted £350+VAT to completely remove the tree & grind the stump to prevent re-growth and following discussion with the Chairman (and in accordance with Financial Regulation 3.4), on 6/11/18 the Clerk instructed Advanced Trees and Grounds to carry out the necessary work.
