SUBJECT: Update on highway, footpath & other matters since 8/5/19

1. Items raised at previous council meetings:-

1. Potholes/uneven surface Hackness Gardens/Drive – reported to Highways 10/5/19. Reply received that “the issue reported does not meet our criteria for repair at this time. We will continue to monitor the problem during our routine inspections”.
2. Uneven surface & worn road marking at junction of Hackness Road and Gardens – reported to Highways 10/5/19. Reply received that “the issue reported does not meet our criteria for repair at this time. We will continue to monitor the problem during our routine inspections”.
3. Trees overhanging pavement (leylandi) and dead cherry trees at corner of Hackness Road/Scalby Road – reported to Highways 10/5/19.
4. Fly tipping at top of Red Scar Lane spotted by Cllr. Thompson a couple of weeks ago – Clerk checked area 9/5/19 and unable to see any fly tipping.
5. Problems with inconsiderate parking on Hackness Garden continue. SBC Parking Services are involved with varying degrees of action/success.

2. New items

1. 23/4/19 Complaint by parishioner re. problems experienced with the playing of ball games in the garden of The Rosette. Chairman spoke with licensee who would have a sign erected.
2. 21/5/19 Column 6 Kingsway reported as out by parishioner. Passed to NYCC via Parish Portal same day. 24/5/19 Repair has been done.
3. 21/5/19 Complaint from resident of Newlands Park Crescent about the encroachment of roots from a tree on the highway verge. Chairman has referred to Highways & asked for a site meeting.
4. 28/5/19 Felled tree and removal of retaining stone wall observed at a property on North Street – Clerk queried with SBC Planning as property in Conservation Area.

4/19 REPORT FROM CHAIRMAN OF THE PARISH COUNCIL FOR 2018/2019

Three applications for Discretionary Grants totalling £4,400 regarding school and sporting activities in the Parish were successful. Additionally a loan of £10,000, repayable over 10 years was made available to Scalby Sports Association. This demonstrates the Council's positive support for their community. During the last year Councillors scrutinised 74 planning applications, of which Council objected to 10. Over the same period we received notification of 7 applications being refused and 4 withdrawn. Councillors also submitted over 40 reports concerning highways and footpaths. A parking problem was resolved in Newlands Park Grove via NYCC agreeing to install "H" bars. The long awaited wider pavement to North Street between Stony Lane and Barmoor Lane has finally been completed. Council asked the Clerk and myself to explore the opportunity for a new Council Office capable of supporting the growing community into the future, this is ongoing. Unfortunately Newby and Scalby In Bloom Group had several members leave at short notice resulting in there being insufficient time to hold the annual Plant sale and The Best Kept Garden Competition. However there are sufficient numbers to continue their activities in the Parish. We are fortunate to have such a dedicated group. On 25 May 2018 the General Data Protection Regulations became law, and the Council has amended its policies accordingly. This is the Council's first financial year using internet banking which appears to be a success in saving time and costs. I am grateful to Councillor Thompson for his support as Vice Chairman and to my fellow Councillors for their commitment, diligence and support over the last 12 months, without which little would have been achieved. I thank our Borough and County Councillors for their continued help and support. I am grateful to our Clerk and Responsible Financial Officer, Jools Marley, for the way she has represented the Council and the thorough and meticulous approach she applies to her role on behalf of Newby and Scalby Parish Council.
