October 2019

One RTC was reported in your area in October. This was a fail to stop RTC on 27/10/19 where a parked car was reported as being hit by another in Ravenscar. There were no lines of enquiry and no witnesses to speak to.

We have had four burglaries/attempted burglaries reported in Scalby area during October.

- An attempted break into a garage at somepoint between 06/10/19 and 13/10/19 where the padlock on the door appears to have been drilled. Nothing was reported stolen.
- On 01/10/19 it was reported that over the previous four days, someone had broken into a house whilst the owners were away. The glass was smashed on the conservatory door. Nothing was stolen.
- On 17/10/19 it was reported that a ripped out kitchen sink, copper pipework and car batteries were stolen from a 'lean-to' on the victims driveway on Station Road. This is still under investigation.
- On 17/10/19 it was reported that entry had been gained the previous night to the George Houltons building site on Scalby Road. Items stolen include **3X Dewalt** tools - Imapact Driver, Electric Planer, Combie Drill- These will have "**HD**" in permanant marker under the battery casing and the batteries. **4 X Makita** tools - Impact Driver with battery, Comby drill with battery, Cordless planer with markings of "**RB**" on in permanat marker. In total about £1500 worth of tools were stolen.

Overnight from 1st to 2nd October, an outbuilding at Northmoor, Wykeham was broken into. Stolen from the building was a **Yamaha YFM350 Grizzly quadbike in blue, a Husqvarna 316TXS Lawn tractor in orange and a Stihl petrol grass strimmer.**

Between 14th and 19th October we received 9 reports of shed burglaries in Brompton and Snainton. It is probable that these all occurred overnight from 13th to 14th October and were discovered by the owners over the next few days. PCSOs/PCs have been to visit all victims and carried out house to house enquiries in the area. Officers working night shifts have been briefed with details of all the incidents. **Please encourage residents to report any suspicious behaviour, especially vans or vehicles parked in unusual places late at night.**

On 19th October, a driver was issued with a Section 59 warning on Scalby Road due to the manner of his driving. This warning stays with the person and vehicle for 12 months and if seen driving in an anti-social manner during this time the car will be seized.

Please note that in addition to the traditional 999 or 101 we can be contacted on our email address is snafiley@northyorkshire.pnn.police.uk. Please do not report incidents to this email, but if you would like to speak to a member of our team for advice then please use it.

If an incident of Anti-Social Behaviour occurs which you would like Police to deal with then please report this as soon as possible after the event to allow Officers the best chance to deal with the culprits. Please do not wait until next time you happen to bump into an Officer or Parish Councillor. It allows us to make connections with other incidents and deal with individuals for

patterns of behaviour rather than incidents in isolation. It does not matter if no suspects have been seen or cannot be identified; we may have this reported on another nearby incident and be able to link them.

PC Bilton has this year carried out various wildlife talks in his role as rural Officer and Wildlife Crime Officer. **If any parish councils would like any information about wildlife crime then please contact your rural team.**

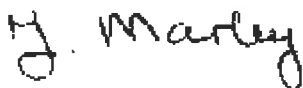
SUBJECT: Update on highway, footpath & other matters since 9/10/19

1. Items raised at previous council meetings:-

1. Parish caretaker/handyman [Minute 131/19.7 refers]. County Cllr. Backhouse has confirmed that he too will make a contribution of £3,000 from his Environment Locality Budget.

2. New items

1. Overhanging greenery/hedges Church Hill Scalby and Scalby Road (west side) from Community Hall to High Street junction. Reg pictured and Jools reported to Area 3 22/10/19.
2. Siding out Hay Lane (Hay Brow Crescent to Church Hill) – to be done by parish caretaker, pictures taken 22/10/19.
3. Various problems with street lights reported via Parish Portal during the month.
4. Overhanging hedge from property on corner of Throxenby Lane and Dunwell Avenue – causing problems for pedestrians on Dunwell Avenue – pictures taken and reported to Area 3 30/10/19.
5. Siding out Scalby Road between Derwent Close and Sea Cut bridge and ivy removal from bridge parapet – pictures taken 30/10/19 and added to parish caretaker list of work.
6. Gauging posts in sea cut upstream of Scalby Road bridge – reported by parishioner as missing or removed. 30/10/19 Environment Agency confirm they have not removed and have no plans to maintain. Presumption the posts have rotted off and been swept downstream in the last 6-9 months. Water levels recorded at next bridge upstream (Hackness Road) and available online 24/7.
7. Field Lane Scalby near entrance to caravan site – possible blocked gully causing flooding across road and problems for pedestrians (raised by parishioner, photographed by chairman) reported to Area 3 31/10/19.
8. Newby Primary School - problem with the flooding at the bottom of the ginnel from Scalby Road – rain for 24 hours on 25/26 October but no sign of flooding continues and is being monitored.
