October 2020

80 incidents were reported to Police in your area during September.

On 5th September at 0430hrs, a vehicle was stopped by Officers on patrol on Scalby Road. The driver failed a roadside drugs test for cocaine so was arrested. He has been released pending results of the blood test.

On 9th September, Scalby and Newby Bowling Club reported that over the last few weeks they have been suffering damage at the pavilion. Most recently, they had 8 wooden fence spears broken. It was believed that youths were responsible as drug and alcohol paraphernalia was also located. Local Officers have been in touch and patrols have increased. No youths have been located at the club during the patrols.

At about 1700hrs on 10th September, a young rider on a moped slid into a parked car on Hackness Road. The rider suffer minor arm injuries.

Officers were called to a disturbance at The Rosette at 2230hrs on 16th September. One male was arrested for a Public Order Offence, detained in the cells overnight and received a caution the next morning.

At about 1930hrs on 18th September, two youths were disturbed breaking into a storage shed at the Youth Hostel on Burniston Road. Two push bikes had been removed but dropped by the offenders when they were seen by the owner.

At about 2145hrs on 18th September, a member of the public came across a single vehicle RTC in Silpho whereby the vehicle had rolled and was resting on its roof. No injuries were suffered by the occupants.

We have received a couple of reports of someone defecating behind the toilets in Ravenscar. Please report this to your local team if you know who it is. Officers have been patrolling more in the Ravenscar area due to this, and reports of BBQs on the road side, people sleeping in cars and other reported issues.

We received three reports of concern for safety of individuals in your ward area during September. These incidents invariably relate to people in distress. We work closely with the Street Triage Mental Health Team at Cross Lane who carry Police radios with them, we also have support from Mental Health professionals who work in our control room. This is sadly becoming an increasing trend at present but we always ensure the people receive the best help available at the time and refer them to other agencies. If necessary, they are referred into the weekly meeting we have with other agencies from around the Borough where we can discuss courses of action to provide best support.

During September we dealt with 860 incidents across the area as a whole, a breakdown of these follows (not inclusive of all incidents):-

- 9 injury/death RTCs.
- 22 damage only RTCs.
- 63 road related offences, drink/drug driving, no insurance/license/dangerous driving/speeding etc...
- 49 reports of suspicious circumstances.
- 8 missing people.
- 0 firearms incident.
- 15 hoax calls.
- 3 Domestic Violence Disclosure Schemes – *commonly referred to as 'Clare's Law' The Scheme was introduced to set out procedures that could be used by the police in relation to disclosure of information about previous violent and abusive offending by a potentially violent individual to their partner where this may help protect them from further violent and abusive offending.*
- 41 domestic incidents.
- 79 concern for safety incidents.
- 5 civil disputes.
- 2 animal incidents
- 31 highway disruptions
- 75 violence crimes.
- 8 sexual offences.

- 17 thefts.
- 2 stolen motor vehicles.
- 29 frauds.
- 2 drug offences.
- 14 criminal damages.
- 5 dwelling or commercial burglaries.
- 2 auto crimes.
- 150 anti-social behaviour reports.

Op Cracker June 2020 – In conjunction with Police Volunteer coordinator, Antony Baldwin and McCains, a new advice booklet has been produced at short notice in response to covid-19. This provides information on a whole host of issues including social distancing, local contacts and general crime prevention advice. We are continuing with four multi-agency meetings per week to combat persistent ASB and assist those most vulnerable people and high risk domestic issues. The meetings are run in conjunction with the Community Impact Team from Scarborough. We currently have 12 live cases that we are dealing with across the area.

If an incident of Anti-Social Behaviour occurs which you would like Police to deal with then please report this as soon as possible after the event to allow Officers the best chance to deal with the culprits. Please do not wait until next time you happen to bump into an Officer or Parish Councillor. It allows us to make connections with other incidents and deal with individuals for patterns of behaviour rather than incidents in isolation. It does not matter if no suspects have been seen or cannot be identified; we may have this reported on another nearby incident and be able to link them.
