42/21 **MINUTES**

42/21.1 Having been previously circulated, the minutes of the Council Meeting held on 5th May 2021 were **approved** as a correct record and Cllr. Towse was **authorised** to sign them.

PROCEDURAL MATTER At 7.02pm, Standing Orders were suspended to allow the Public Open Forum.

43/21 **PUBLIC OPEN FORUM** Rev. Hand congratulated the Clerk and Councillors on the community hub.

PROCEDURAL MATTER At 7.03pm, Standing Orders were resumed.

44/21 **MATTERS RAISED IN PUBLIC OPEN FORUM** Rev. Hand's congratulations on the work involved in creating the hub were noted.

45/21 **EXTERNAL REPORTS**

45/21.1 **Police:-** The June and July reports for Scalby (*June emailed to councillors 8/7/21, July circulated with agenda*) were **received & noted**. Reports for Newby had not been received.

45/21.2 **County Council:- received** County Cllr. Bastiman's report 1] he was now a member of NYCC's Executive; 2] elections for the new Unitary authority would take place in 2022 and would be for a 5 year term (1 year as a shadow council and then 4 years as a unitary); 3] NYCC libraries had extended free computer access to one hour a day free of charge.

45/21.3 **Borough Council:-** Borough Cllr. Sharma reported a vote had recently been taken on whether or not the Argos redevelopment project still gave value for money – it was unclear what the result of the vote had been. Other matters he raised included 1] the lack of white lining at Coldyhill Lane/Green Lane junction, 2] the poor state of the cinder track in the Coldyhill Lane/Endcliffe Crescent area and 3] a need to side out the pavement near the bus shelter at the bottom of Moor Lane.

46/21 **UPDATES ON VARIOUS MATTERS & COUNCILLOR'S REPORTS**

46/21.1 Clerk reported that due to a typo on her part it had been necessary to re-state a couple of the figures on Section 2 of the 20/21 external audit form. PKF Littlejohn had accepted the re-statement and drew it to Council's attention on their final report as a matter not affecting their opinion. There were no matters raised by the external auditor which gave them cause for concern and the 2020/21 external audit had now concluded.

September 2021

There were 70 incidents reported in your area during September.

04/09/2021 16:02 – Officers on patrol on A171 just north of Cloughton spotted a vehicle which they suspected may contain a person wanted by West Yorkshire Police for domestic related crimes. The person was located within the vehicle, arrested and collected by West Yorkshire officers from Scarborough custody later in the day.

05/09/2021 14:23 – The rider of an off-road motor bike was stopped by officers on patrol in Wykeham Forest. They were seen leaving a forest path which was not part of the public highway. They were reported for this offence. This incident was part of an organised operation with the rural team from Eastfield Police Station whereby marked off-road Police bikes will be on patrol in the area on a continued basis throughout the winter.

05/09/2021 16:26 – A pedestrian was stuck by a car on Low Road near to the entrance of Ox Pasture Hall Hotel. Thankfully, the injuries were not life threatening or changing. The matter remains under investigation.

05/09/2021 19:00 – The driver of a car was issued with a traffic offence report for taking a photograph on their mobile phone of the above incident, whilst driving, in full view of a traffic Police Officer.

08/09/2021 14:00 – A self-employed resident was the victim of fraud over the phone. They received a call from scammers purporting to be from a Bailiffs acting on behalf of the High Court. They stated the victim had not paid any PAYE and they were attending the business premises to recover items or money. The scammers were very persuasive which resulted in almost £500 being transferred. A call to the High Courts revealed this was a scam and as the money had gone into the other account, the bank would not refund it. **Please carry out your own enquiries with your accountant/bank before transferring money to what may seem like a legitimate organisation.**

We received 11 reports of concern for safety of an individual in your ward area during September. These incidents invariably relate to people in distress. We work closely with the Street Triage Mental Health Team at Cross Lane who carry Police radios with them, we also have support from Mental Health professionals who work in our control room. This is sadly becoming an increasing trend at present but we always ensure the people receive the best help available at the time and refer them to other agencies. If necessary, they are referred into the weekly meeting we have with other agencies from around the Borough where we can discuss courses of action to provide best support.

The average time taken to answer 101 calls in September 2021 was 309.35 seconds.

During September we dealt with 791 incidents across the area as a whole, a breakdown of these follows (not inclusive of all incidents): -

- 58 road related offences, drink/drug driving, no insurance/license/dangerous driving/speeding etc...
- 65 reports of suspicious circumstances.

- 4 Domestic Violence Disclosure Scheme – *commonly referred to as 'Clare's Law' The Scheme was introduced to set out procedures that could be used by the police in relation to disclosure of information about previous violent and abusive offending by a potentially violent individual to their partner where this may help protect them from further violent and abusive offending.*

- 81 concern for safety incidents.
- 7 civil disputes.
- 4 animal incidents
- 22 highway disruptions
- 84 violence crimes.

Dear Parish Council,

My name is [REDACTED] and I live [REDACTED] I'm a retired Sport & Leisure lecturer who has assisted with a number of projects locally.

I am writing to you on behalf of the Scalby & Newby Community Hall group, whom I have started working with, to assess whether the area around the Hall could be enhanced as a recreation & leisure hotspot/hub.

I've made some preliminary suggestions which seem to be quite well received by the group and by Scarborough's sports development officer.

These include:

- 2 picnic tables for families who already 'play' on the old bowling green
- 2 boules pitches close to the tennis club to enhance the French connection and offer an alternative bowls game.
- A set of outdoor exercise stations which many other areas have in the UK
- Possible permanent outdoor table tennis table

So, I am writing to ask what support might be possible for these ideas which are very much in the embryonic stage?

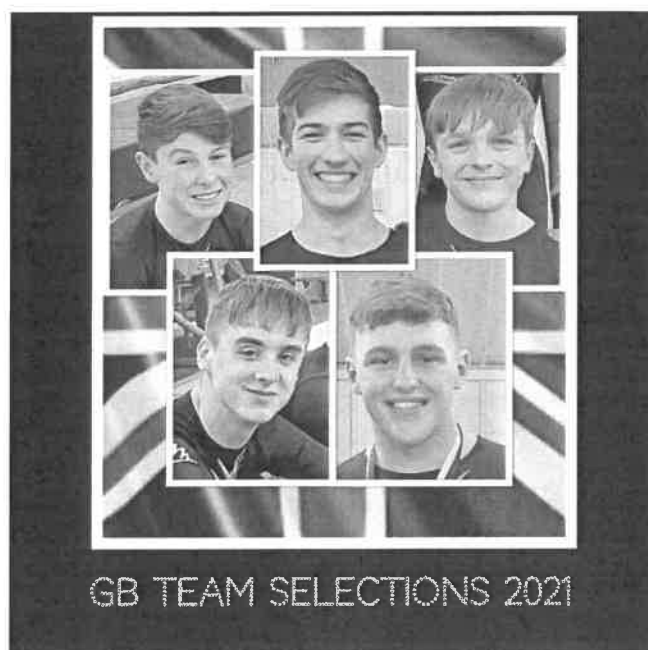
I am happy to come to a meeting to explain further and answer any questions.

Scarborough Gymnasts Secure Places in the GB Teams



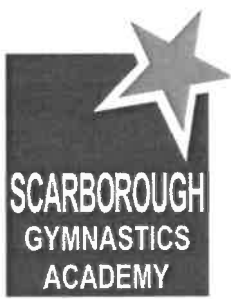

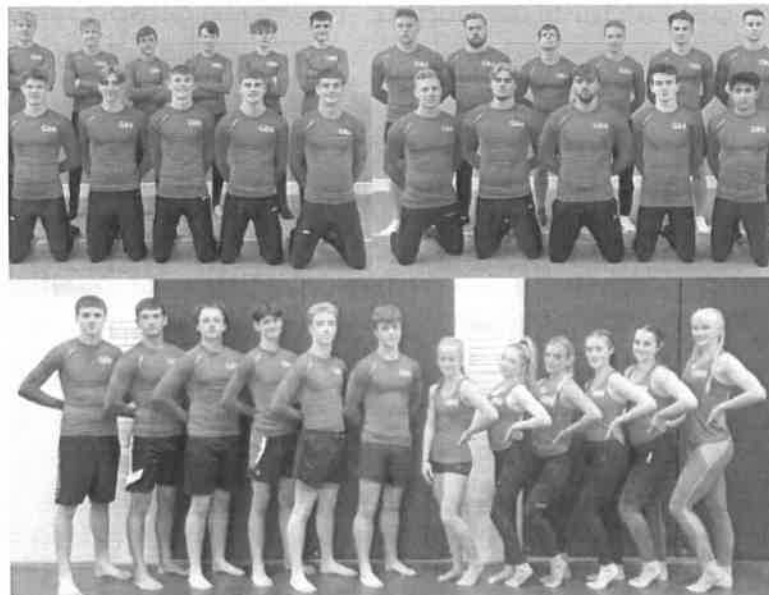
