89/21 **MINUTES**
89/21.1 Having been previously circulated, the minutes of the Council Meeting held on 10th November 2021 were **approved** as a correct record and **authorised** for signature by Cllr. Towse.

92/21 **EXTERNAL REPORTS**
92/21.1 **Police:-** The Scalby report for November (emailed to councillors on 6th December) was **received & noted**. PCSO Loureiro reported crime in Newby was down. Councillors were very pleased to learn work had been done on parking – Newby & Scalby Primary, St. Peter's and Barrowcliff schools have all had leaflets and letters highlighting the Police being aware of parking concerns. The SBC Considerate Parking Initiative is to be again used for parking near schools. PCSO O'Reilly's written report was **received & noted**.

At this point the Police left the meeting.

92/21.2 **County Council:-** On the heels of power cuts exceeding 24 hours suffered in nearby parishes after Storm Arwen, Cllr. Thompson asked why the Parish Council couldn't be more involved with emergency planning in the parish now we had the hub and what could be done – this resulted in a prolonged discussion, the outcome of which was that NYCC held the remit for resilience and emergency planning. As a consequence of the long debate the Clerk had been unable to give the verbal report of information on County matters as requested by County Cllr. Bastiman.

92/21.3 **Borough Council:-** Borough Cllr. Sharma reported 1] he had submitted a grant request to his SBC Locality Grant allocation and 2] concerns regarding the clearance of the building site at 79 Cross Lane in respect of A] it was believed badgers were resident there and B] some of the adjoining landowners maintained they owned land which the developer was trying to claim as his.

At this point Cllr. Sharma left the meeting.

December 2021

There were 72 incidents reported in your area during December.

02/12/2021 01:40 – Officers on night shift patrol reported the A171 at Cloughton Bank was impassable due to snow. The Highways Agency were called out to assist.

06/12/2021 16:29 – The driver of a car reports being involved in a single vehicle RTC in Harwood Dale near to Ellis Close Farm. Officers attended to assist the driver with recovery of the vehicle and then took them back to their home address.

12/12/2021 14:46 – Officers on a planned Operation in High Langdale Forest stop two transport vehicles and five quad bikes. Three of the quadbikes were seized, two for having no insurance and one for a Section.59 offence. All five riders were issued with further Section.59 warnings which relates to anti-social use of vehicles and various traffic offences are also to be investigated. All the riders had travelled a substantial distance to go off-roading in the Forest.

17/12/2021 17:30 – An assault was reported from a car in Suffield. One person was arrested and later charged with Sec.47 Assault, driving whilst disqualified and driving without insurance. They were bailed to an address out of North Yorkshire and will be appearing at court later in January.

21/12/2021 15:52 – A damage only RTC was reported on Storr Lane at Hackness.

We received 4 report of concern for safety of an individual in your ward area during December. These incidents invariably relate to people in distress. We work closely with the Street Triage Mental Health Team at Cross Lane who carry Police radios with them, we also have support from Mental Health professionals who work in our control room. This is sadly becoming an increasing trend at present but we always ensure the people receive the best help available at the time and refer them to other agencies. If necessary, they are referred into the weekly meeting we have with other agencies from around the Borough where we can discuss courses of action to provide best support.

The average time taken to answer 101 calls in December 2021 was 225 seconds.

During December we dealt with 704 incidents across the area as a whole, a breakdown of these follows (not inclusive of all incidents): -

- 10 injury/death RTCs.
- 27 damage only RTCs.
- 32 road related offences, drink/drug driving, no insurance/license/dangerous driving/speeding etc...
- 63 reports of suspicious circumstances.
- 14 missing persons.
- 0 firearms incidents.
- 7 hoax calls.
- 4 Domestic Violence Disclosure Scheme – *commonly referred to as 'Clare's Law' The Scheme was introduced to set out procedures that could be used by the police in relation to disclosure of information about previous violent and abusive offending by a potentially violent individual to their partner where this may help protect them from further violent and abusive offending.*
- 57 domestic incidents/violence.
- 76 concern for safety incidents.
- 8 civil disputes.
- 6 animal incidents
- 22 highway disruptions
- 56 violence crimes.
- 2 sexual offences.
- 14 thefts.
- 2 stolen motor vehicles.
- 6 fraud or forgery.

- 3 drug offences.
- 16 criminal damages.
- 5 dwelling or commercial burglaries.
- 4 auto crimes.
- 81 anti-social behaviour reports.

If an incident of Anti-Social Behaviour occurs which you would like Police to deal with then please report this as soon as possible after the event to allow Officers the best chance to deal with the culprits. Please do not wait until next time you happen to bump into an Officer or Parish Councillor. It allows us to make connections with other incidents and deal with individuals for patterns of behaviour rather than incidents in isolation. It does not matter if no suspects have been seen or cannot be identified; we may have this reported on another nearby incident and be able to link them.

North Yorkshire Community Messenger

At the July MS Teams catch up with Police and Councils, it was asked about the possibility of North Yorkshire Community Messenger (NYCM) automatically posting to a Parish Council social media account or web site. Having spoken to our Corporate Communications department, in short, this isn't possible, but...

There is a share option on the bottom of each message, you can share it to a social media account or elsewhere via this. So, if you have an email list, or other distribution list set up of people who are not on community messenger then the messages can be shared to this in a few seconds.

NYCM is a format that all Community Officers have received recent training in and are planning to use more often. It takes a few seconds for you to sign up and receive regular updates about what's occurring in your neighbourhood.

Derwent & Hertford Rural Watch – December

This time of year is never easy and with current financial constraints it can only get worse if we aren't all careful.

With potentially expensive Christmas gifts in the house, and perhaps going away for the Christmas holidays leaving homes unoccupied, this time of year may leave you vulnerable to theft and/or break ins. So, ensure your front and back doors are secure as they are your first line of defence. Invest in good quality door locks, which will provide the necessary security.

You could also use SMART technology and keyless locks to help protect your home; Smart technology can make your home look occupied even if you are away either for the day or for a holiday. Smart plugs can be set on timers or controlled automatically with some systems even have a built-in vacation mode to randomly turn lights on or off during evening or morning hours to give the appearance someone is home. So if you are tech-savvy you can really secure your home

There are those who prey on homes where packages are delivered when no-one is in; to avoid this happening, make sure you get deliveries for when you are in or have them delivered to a package bank or perhaps a neighbour if you know them well enough.

If you are going away for the Christmas festivities, please **DON'T** post it on social media!! You would be surprised how many openly say "I'm going away" then wonder how they have been burgled! So make it a practise not to state when or where you are going; if you have to tell friends, tell them face to face or by text message. Tighten up your social media security by not divulging your exact position, remove any mention of your marital status – just generally keep your private information just that – private!

Fire Safety at Christmas

And as a fire security aside, check your Christmas lights for faults and don't leave them on overnight; check that bulbs do not need changing and if they do, buy good quality replacements to avoid the possibility of fire.
