SPORTS AND RECREATIONAL- COMMUNITY CHEST AWARDS

As a result of an initiative by Councillor Derek Bastiman, Newby and Scalby Parish Council have set up a fund which will make grants to Sports and Recreational Groups in Newby and Scalby.

In setting up this initiative Councillor Bastiman said: "My fellow Parish Councillors agreed with me that it is very important for the local community to have thriving groups and organizations which provide an outlet for whatever social, recreational or sporting activities that members of the community wish to engage in.

In encouraging such activities it will help to sustain, promote and encourage the well being of the Members of such Organisations and Clubs within the Parish. In other words, to leave a legacy of healthier people.

In this day and age of financial uncertainty and a greater reliance on technology people, particularly young people, need to be encouraged to take an active interest in physical exercise and face to face social interaction. In providing financial support to local groups and organisations I feel it will assist and encourage them to continue their valiant efforts which will undoubtedly benefit many people".

Organisations and Clubs with a membership of up to 25 members can apply for an award of up to £250. Where memberships exceed 25 then the award will be up to £500. The funding will be available until 31 March 2011.

The Chairman, Bill Miller, and Councillor Bastiman say "We are very pleased that the Parish Council has approved this initiative which is aimed at all age groups within the Parish of Newby and Scalby.

We encourage any interested Organisation or Club to request an application form, complete it and return it as soon as possible as decisions on awards will be made on a regular weekly basis. The sooner you apply, the sooner a decision can be made."

CHAIRMAN'S REPORT 2009/2010

Fellow Councillors, Parishioners of Newby and Scalby

Throughout the last year one of the Council's main projects, from the 1st April 2009 in fact, was the Management and Refurbishment of the former Parish Hall, now known as the Newby and Scalby Community Hall, as a fully functional community facility – but more of this later. While day to day business grew evermore demanding our Clerks were allocated specific tasks to cope with this workload.

In today's local government it is necessary to work in partnership with national and local agencies or organisations, pooling resources, experience and expertise in order to achieve our common goals.

Take for example the Parish Council's work with the Borough, County Council, Environmental Agency, Scarborough Rural Area Forum, Duchy of Lancaster, Yorkshire Water and North Yorkshire Fire and Rescue, to alleviate the recent and now all too often, flooding in and around the Church Becks/Scalby Beck Road.

We support the Newby and Scalby in Bloom Group along with the Scalby Village Trust. The former last year achieving a Silver Gilt Award. All those litter picks, balsam bashing and planting floral beds and tubs paid off in the end. My thanks in particular to its Chairman, Peter Stavely and all his Committee helpers for the sterling work they do and achieve. Speaking of planting – bulbs in particular, Councillor Bastiman single-handedly planted hundreds of spring bulbs around the Church Beck Green – earning him the title of "Bulb Master of the Year". Seriously, my thanks as part of the many tasks you undertake in the Community.

The Parish Council made comment and representation at the recent Local Development Framework consultation exhibitions, featuring areas of land for housing development, e.g. High Mill Farm, Ridge Green and Castlemount. Along with Scalby Village Trust's concerns the Parish recently have held informal talks with the Duchy of Lancaster's Agent to keep us in the loop on these sensitive areas in our Parish. However as you will be aware the High Mill Farm received outline planning approval, despite the number of objections.

We are still working on an enhancement scheme for the Linden Road Play Area. The Newby and Scalby Bloom Group's successful Produce Show shall take place again this year as will the Best Kept Garden/Business Premises competition.

Our allotments continue to flourish – get it – through the diligence of its holders and Friends Group.

Other than the High Mill Farm plans, other planning applications handled by the Council were, East Park, Petts' Wood, the Miners Cottages, Hay Lane (now thankfully fully restored), the Health Village, now under construction along with Cross Lane Hospital.

Mr Peter Afford and the Cricket Club are to be congratulated for all their efforts in maintaining both Football and Cricket Clubs high thriving existence and successful teams of dedicated youngsters.

Many of our Councillors represent our Parish on Borough, County and local groups – to each and every

one of them I am grateful for their contributions to our Parish and Community.

Scalby and Newby Twinning Association shall be hosting 50 residents from Pornic, France in June, coinciding with Monsieur Bonnet, the Mayor opening Scalby Fair.

Work on our Newsletter will continue with the web pages taking more precedence in future months.

At the end of March this year, Mike McGuinn our Clerk, retired after more than 10 years loyal and dedicated service to the Council and its Parishioners.

My previous report gave details of Mike's and Councillors Bastiman and Pickersgill involvement with the phase one refurbishment of the Community Hall and we are all feeling the benefit of this facility. I must add my thanks to our Caretaker, Darren for receiving numerous compliments on his work and attitude to the many organisations who hire the Hall – keep up the good work.

I wish our newly appointed Clerk, Tony Spencer well for the future. I thank my Vice-Chairman, Councillor Syd Foote for his support and all the Councillors over the past year and hope the Parish continues to prosper in the years ahead – coalition or partnership!

HELPING CHILDREN IN YOUR COMMUNITY

The Retired & Senior Volunteer Programme was created by the national charity Community Service Volunteers in 1988. Its aim is to encourage older people to support themselves and their community by offering their skills and life experience.

Over four thousand volunteers help in schools, developing an inter-generational rapport with young people. It has been found that in just one term individual attention given by a volunteer can raise a child's reading age by a year, improving their self confidence and willingness to learn. The schools programme received support by government and Business In The Community when it was realised some years ago that tens of thousands of children were failing to achieve national literacy levels.

Volunteers are an invaluable resource to teachers, enabling them to devote more time to the children who need it most. The work for the volunteer is extremely rewarding, becoming a valued member of the school by

pupils, staff and parents.

The volunteer will find that as the children become to know you they look forward to your regular visits and are very welcoming. "It must be Friday, Jim's in school" is a statement I often hear from staff, or "Mr Martin" by the children.

The core work of our volunteers is listening to Primary School children read and if you possess other appropriate skills, you will probably find that when your class teacher discovers these you will be asked to employ them also, but that choice is up to you.

You don't have to be too senior or retired to take part, we ask volunteers to commit to a minimum of one hour per week.

Report from Chairman Geoffrey Archer

LOCAL POLICE CONTACT

Chris Hunter is your local PCSO for the area.

Below are details of some of the tasks he carries out daily:

1. PATROLS – I patrol the whole area of Newby, but I particular focus my attention on hotspot areas that have been identified to myself. For example, The Croft has attracted a number or reported anti social behaviour incidents involving large number of youths congregating, drinking and using drugs. Since the Police have ensured that regular patrols are made around The Croft area, the number of anti social behaviour incidents have significantly reduced. These figures have also been backed up with the results from the recent Neighbourhood watch survey on The Croft, showing the decrease in incidents and also by better morale from the residents.

Another hotspot area which is being currently focused on is along Scalby Beck. There has been may reports of anti-social behaviour in particular drinking and use of drugs. Regular patrols by PC Allison and myself have successfully located two groups of people. The first group of people were drinking alcohol, however no offence had taken place but they were given words of advice. The second group were a group of people fishing who were not members, these people have also been talked to and moved on from the area.

The above two areas will continue to be regularly patrolled.

2. LIAISON OFFICER - Since February 2009, I became the liaison officer for Newby School. Since starting I have been into the school to talk face to face with the pupils to introduce myself and to explain the job that a PCSO does. I have also given talks on 'stranger danger' and 'playing safe'. To make sure that I have high visibility for the pupils and for their families, I attend the school at the beginning of the day and also when pupils are leaving school. This has ensured that I provide a point contact which I can enforce local policing.

3. REGULAR VISITS – I perform regular visits to local off

licenses to show Police presence to deter youths entering the premises and also to give advice to the shop owners on challenging anyone who looks under 21 by ensuring they provide identification. I also give advice to the general public concerning buying alcohol for an underage youth and that this can attract a fine up to £5000

4. YOUTH CONTACT - I regularly visit the Youth Café on Moor Lane to maintain contact and support to youths and to give them advice on issues they may have. Also the youths know that this is a regular point I visit so it is a main point of contact for them to see myself.

DIAL A RIDE COMMUNITY TRANSPORT

Dial A Ride is a local, independent charity offering door-to-door, fully accessible transport on a daily basis in a 9 mile radius of Scarborough and Filey. We can be used by anyone over retirement age, people who have any sort of disability or mobility problem, or residents of rural areas whose area is not served by public transport and do not have access to a car. So you don't have to be elderly or need to use a wheelchair to enjoy the benefits of Dial A Ride!

Our 9 minibuses are either low floor or are fitted with hydraulic lifts or ramps as well as low steps and grab rails for ease of boarding. The buses can accommodate most types of wheelchairs (electric and manual) and can also carry motorised scooters - although passengers must dismount their scooters before getting on the bus and cannot sit on them whilst travelling.

If you are eligible for Dial A Ride, then you can use us

for any reason. For example shopping, visiting friends or relatives, going to church; day centres; pubs and restaurants; training, leisure and educational pursuits as well as keeping any sort of health related appointments. You can bring a friend, carer or relative with you on your journey at an additional flat fare of just £2.00

Our minibuses (with driver) are also available for hire by eligible groups who want to organise day excursions or short trips (max capacity 14 seated passengers) and if you want to travel further afield, we will try our best to help.

Although we employ some paid drivers, but rely on our volunteer drivers and passenger escorts to keep Dial A Ride 'on the road'. We receive just 15% of our income from annual grants, the rest we have to generate ourselves through fares, fundraising and donations.

All our drivers, both paid and voluntary, are MiDAS assessed (Minibus Driver Assessment Scheme) and receive training in first aid as well as many other areas of passenger safety comfort and awareness. All members of staff have to undergo an enhanced Criminal Record Bureau Check.

To make a booking, simply telephone the office on 01723 **354434**. The first time you call, we will take all necessary details. There is a small annual membership fee of £2 to pay plus your fare. Then, you simply need to tell us when and where you want to go—leave the rest to us!
